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ONLY FOUR OF THE INCUMBENTS FROM THE CURRENT COMMISSION LOOK CERTAIN TO BE REAPPOINTED TO THE NEXT COMMISSION, NONE OF WHOM HAVE HELD HIGH-PROFILE PORTFOLIOS IN THE LAST TERM.

INEXPERIENCE AND LACK OF CONTINUITY ARE USUALLY FACTORS POINTING TO INCREASED POWER AND INFLUENCE FOR THE SERVICES — IN PARTICULAR, THE SECRETARY GENERAL, AND THE SENIOR LEVELS IN THE GENERAL DIRECTORATES – WHO WILL PLAY A KEY ROLE IN POLITICAL AGENDA SETTING. WITH THE QUESTION OF SENIOR POSITIONS, SUCH AS THE COMMISION PRESIDENCY, HIGH REPRESENTATIVE, AND EUROGROUP CHAIR STILL BEING DEBATED BY EU LEADERS, MANY 'NAMES IN THE MIX' COULD FIND THEMSELVES ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE NEXT COMMISSION IF THEIR MEMBER STATE SECURES A HIGH-PROFILE POST.

FOR MEMBER STATES, GETTING ONE OF THE SENIOR POLITICAL POSITIONS IN THE NEXT COMMISSION WILL ALWAYS SUPERSEDE ISSUES OF NAMES AND PERSONAL AFFILIATIONS.
